1 [re UK] ... Theresa May's Brexit deal wasn't just defeated on Tuesday night, it was crushed. She lost by 230 votes -

the largest defeat for a sitting government in history - with 118 of her own Conservative MPs among them....

Jeremy Corbyn reacted to the defeat by tabling a vote of no confidence in her government. That vote will take place

on Wednesday, and if the Labour leader wins, it could trigger a general election. He's unlikely to succeed though -

because despite voting against her deal, Mrs May's own MPs, and those of the Northern Irish DUP, don't want to open

the door to Downing Street to Mr Corbyn. If the Labour leader does fail, pressure will grow on him to throw his weight

behind a second referendum as the only option left to stop Mrs May. Scotland's first minister is among those backing

that option.

European Council President Donald Tusk suggested that cancelling Brexit altogether was now "the only positive solution", but Mrs May insisted that wasn't going to happen. She said that if she survived the confidence vote she would offer cross-party talks to find a way forward - and presumably go back to Brussels to see what changes can be made. Brexiteer and former Tory minister Boris Johnson said she now had "a massive mandate" to do just that.
